## Refresher on SMART Objectives



Specific

A precise description of what action or outcome is being proposed (includes naming who will do it)



Measurable

A defined figure that will allow the objective to be evaluated, as well as demonstrate its completion



Achievable

The objective is realistic, given the resources, times, staffing, etc.



Relevant

The objective and what is proposed is directly linked to the goal, the FOA, and the mission of the program or department



Time-Phased

The objectives includes indications of when it will be completed

Example: By the end of June, 2018, the health education staff will increase the efficacy of Tribal members to respond to the identified signs and symptoms of suicidal ideation by 15% through the implementation of a multi-session educational curriculum.
