Tobacco Policy: Brief History

• 1964 – US Surgeon Report <u>"Commercial Tobacco is harmful"</u>

1983 – Keam's Canyon Hospital 1st hospital to go smoke free!

Indian Health Services (IHS) Northwest Regional Agency:

1st indoor public workplaces to go smoke free!


US Department of Health – Domino effect worldwide...

 Planes, restaurants, bars, public places, and workplaces worldwide began to adopt smoke free policies...

 However, Tribal Casinos & Tribal Governments and Private Casinos are now the only places without smoke-free regulations

Health Impacts

- Higher risk of experiencing tobacco-related disease and death due to high prevalence of cigarettes and commercial tobacco use (CDC, 2018)
- Leading cause of death among AI/AN include:
 - Cardiovascular disease #1 cause of death Doubles persons risk for stroke
 - 2nd leading cause of death cancer (Lung Cancer #1)
 - Diabetes 4th leading cause of death risk of developing is 30 40% higher among smokers
- More AI/AN woman smoke during pregnancy than any other racial group in the nation (CDC, 2018)
 - Causes early childhood effects, preterm delivery, stillbirth, low weight birth, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS)
- The prevalence of nicotine dependent is higher than for any other substance abuse disorder!

 (American Society of Addiction Medicine, 2008)

FINANCIAL BENEFITS FOR TRIBAL **CASINOS REOPENING 100% SMOKEFREE**

- Reduced disease, death and health care costs for tribes
- Lower health insurance for workers
- Reduced property and life insurance costs
- Reduced maintenance, equipment, furnishings and cleaning costs
- Less financial investment in multimillion \$ ventilation systems
- Reduced risk of litigation from casino workers
- 90% of millennials and young U.S. adults are nonsmokers, including most casino staff and customers.
- People will stay longer and visit more frequently smoke-free venues, including casinos result in spending more money \$\$\$
- New innovative market for next generation (young generation value healthier lifestyles)
- 100% Smoke-Free casinos will promote gaming to "millennials and baby boomers"!
- Employees will be more motivated to work sustainable workforce!
- Airlines, bars, & restaurants) were told they would not make money if they went smoke-free Tobacco Industry tactics are false!
- Estimated over 400 state owned casinos are 100% smoke-free!!

CASINOS GOING SMOKEFREE MATTERS

Every worker deserves to breathe smokefree air. Casino, bar, & restaurant workers are more exposed to toxic secondhand smoke in their jobsite compared to other segments of the U.S.

The Surgeon General Concluded:

- · There is no risk-free level of secondhand smoke
- Separating smokers from nonsmokers, cleaning the air, and ventilating buildings cannot eliminate exposure of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke
- · Heating, air conditioning and ventilation systems alone cannot eliminate exposure to secondhand smoke
- 100% smokefree workplace policies are the only effective way to eliminate secondhand smoke exposure in the workplace

Secondhand Smoke Can Cause:

Exposure to secondhand smoke causes an estimated 41,000 deaths from lung cancer and heart disease among adults each year in the United States.

- · Heart Disease · Lung Cancer · Respiratory Disease
- · Adverse Effects on the Health of Infants and Children

Smoke-free Policies:

- · Improve Air Quality
- Reduce Secondhand Smoke Exposure Reduce Smoking
- Improve Health Receive Public Support
- Result in High Levels of Compliance











Reclaiming the Sacred use of Tobacco
